- The nominee may be living or deceased.
- The nominee, if a public servant, can not be in office or have been in office at least 3 years prior to the nomination. The nominee is not being nominated solely for public service.
- A nomination may be made by more than one individual, the more support the stronger the nomination.

#### **NOMINATION PROCESS**

- 1) To nominate an individual for this honor, a nomination form must be completed and submitted to the Wall of Honor Committee for review. The committee is made up of 7 individuals who represent the diversity of the community.
- Nominations will be called each year and accepted up until November 30 each year.
- 3) All new nominations will be reviewed and voted on by the committee no later than March 31.
- 4) The person who submitted the nomination will be notified shortly after the vote is finalized. Notification to the recipient's family will be planned out accordingly.
- The number of recipients will be limited to a maximum of two per year; there may be years when no individuals are nominated and/or no nominees are selected to receive this award

#### **New Police Station Update:**

Construction of a new Police Station continues. This project will provide the Northampton Township Police Department (NTPD) with a larger Police Headquarters. The department moved into its current 8,000 square foot headquarters when 21 officers patrolled the growing township of over 20,000 residents. Since the original headquarters building was dedicated in 1976, the population and the number of active officers have nearly doubled to 39,729 residents (2010 U.S. Census) and 43 officers. The department also now employs 6 full-time and 5 part-time civilians.

The new building will be approximately 26,000 square feet providing the crucial space needed to ensure the continued effective and efficient Police operations in areas such as: Quality of Life Unit; Department officers assigned to duties in the South Central Emergency Response Team (S.E.R.T.), the Bucks County Major Incident Response Team (M.I.R.T.), the Crisis Intervention Team, Accident Reconstructionists, the Bucks County Homicide by Vehicle Task Force, forensic experts in the fields of Crime Scene Investigation and Forensic Document Examination.

In addition, the NTPD is a booking/processing center that processes 1500 arrests a year as a regional booking facility for more than 21 law enforcement agencies. The booking facility is the second most active booking center in all of Bucks County. The NTPD Headquarters will include: an expanded and secure evidence storage facility, a secure evidence processing area, five interview rooms that are used to interact with victims and interview suspects; specific juvenile rooms that are separated from adult interviews/offenders; a four-lane firearms range to be used for yearly, mandatory police officer training qualifications; and a physical training area to be utilized for expandable baton, handcuffing and hand-hold technique training while maintaining the physical fitness of officers.


This new, and much needed facility, will provide the Northampton Township Police Department with the space and resources to continue providing quality policing services for the next 40+ years.

#### ADMINISTRATION BUILDING HOLIDAY CLOSING!

The administration building will be closed on the following dates:

November 22 - 23 (Thanksgiving) and December 22 - January 1 (Holiday & New Year). We will reopen on Wednesday, January 2, 2019.

**Yard Waste Change:** Starting the week of December 17th through March 31st yard waste is collected the SAME DAY as trash and limited to (5) five containers. Biodegradable bags are not required. Trash cans 32 gallons or smaller and plastic bags may be used during this time. Leaf and yard waste collection will resume to unlimited collection the week of April 1st, 2019 following trash/recycling collection day.

**Christmas Tree Disposal:** Collection of Christmas trees will occur the week of January 14th, 2019. Christmas trees will be collected the day after your trash/recycle collection day. Please do not put your tree out before this week.

There's a snowstorm coming. Is trash going to be picked up? Collection will occur during inclement weather unless cancelled by J. P. Mascaro. We will then announce the cancellation on our website www.northamptontownship.com. Should J. P. Mascaro cancel a scheduled collection due to a weather event, then collection will occur the next day. All areas of the township will also be collected one day late for the rest of the week if a cancellation occurs. Please note: if no weather-related cancellation was announced, you should place your trash and recyclables at the curb by 6:00 AM-the trash trucks will not be sent back to a residences that did not place trash to curb on time.

There is a dead deer along the road. Will the Township pick it up? No. The Public Works Department does not pick up dead animals. For local roads, call the Pennsylvania Game Commission at (610) 926-3136. For state roads, which are (Almshouse Road, Bustleton Road, Holland Road, Jacksonville Road, Newtown-Richboro Road, Second Street Pike, Bridgetown Pike, Bristol Road, Buck Road, Churchville Road, Old Bristol Road, Worthington Mill Road), call PennDOT at (215) 345-6060.

#### BATTLE OF THE HAMPTONS" FOOD DRIVE 2018

Once again, the employees and residents of Northampton Township worked together during a three-week community food collection to benefit the Jesus Focus Ministry Food Pantry at Bethanna. The two other "Hamptons", Upper Southampton and Lower Southampton, accepted our challenge to collect for JFM Bethanna and the Assumption BVM pantry in Feasterville. And the battle commenced!

All three Townships topped their collection numbers from the prior year and the pantries were thrilled with the results. The Northampton Township Senior Center and Parks & Recreation Department both filled their collection bins at their respective locations, along with the Library and Administration Buildings. Everyone did a phenomenal job of filling their bins multiple times. Plus, we had over \$600 in cash donations from our very generous residents which we used to purchase even more food.

The JFM Pantry at Bethanna also received 3,286 pounds from Upper Southampton Township, and Assumption BVM received 1,085 pounds from Lower Southampton Township. This was a great team effort by all three Townships. As the saying goes, "Teamwork makes the dream work!"

#### NOW SERVING ALL OF NORTHAMPTON TOWNSHIP

Tri-Hampton Rescue Squad (THRS) was established in 1942 as a non-profit volunteer organization with the mission of providing emergency medical care to our community. As one of the first ambulance services founded in Bucks County, our service area encompassed many surrounding municipalities in our infancy. Today we are one of fifteen organizations within Bucks County that provide 9-1-1 Emergency Medical Services to the community.

For the past fifty years we have provided our service to all of Upper Southampton & Lower Southampton and approximately eighty percent of Northampton Township. Through a resolution passed by the Board of Supervisors in August of 2018, as of September 1st, 2018, Tri-Hampton Rescue Squad is now the primary EMS provider for all of Northampton Township. As a result, we are proud to continue providing Advanced Life Support (ALS) and Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulance service 24 hours a day to nearly 74,000 residents within the 40 square mile territory that we cover. Last year our highly trained Paramedics and EMTs were called on more than 5,500 times for service.

While we operate three physical station locations, that each cover a portion of Northampton Township, we also operate a fourth ambulance during peak hours of the week to ensure we have adequate resources available for those who may need our services. Therefore, you may see our ambulances on the road, or staged throughout our coverage area from time to time. This is all done in an effort to ensure we can provide the best service to our entire community! We are very community oriented and have excellent working relationships with our local government officials to ensure that residents are receiving the best service possible. We also work very closely with our local Fire and Police Departments so that no matter what your emergency is, we are able there to help. Aside from responding to 9-1-1 emergencies 24/7/365, we also provide other services throughout the community including:

- Special event EMS stand-by services at large community gatherings or sporting events;
- Community training in first-aid, CPR, and other public safety topics;
- Tactical EMS (TEMS) support for the South Central Emergency Response Team (SERT) during high risk law enforcement situations throughout the response area;
- Blood draw services at the Northampton Township Police Dept in order to more efficiently process drivers suspected of driving under the influence (DUI).

Our operations are primarily funded through revenue received from the billable services that we provide. However, on average that only covers eighty-two percent (82%) of our \$2.3 million in annual operating expenses. We pay over \$200,000/year in additional expense for capital items including vehicle and equipment replacement, bringing the total amount required to provide service to nearly \$2.5 million annually.

We are grateful to the taxpayers of Northampton Township for the contribution of \$70,000/ year that, in conjunction with the tax support from Upper Southampton & Lower Southampton, helps bridge the gap in our budget. Mindful of the burdens of high taxes,



THRS has not requested a tax increase for our services in more than 20 years! Unfortunately, the costs associated with providing our services do continue to increase each year. This year we face an unfunded deficit of over \$300,000.

In order to raise the money that is needed to fund our continued operations, we offer our residents a subscription program. Most insurance plans, including Medicare, do not cover 100% of the costs for ambulance services. Participation in this program ensures that you will not be responsible for paying the high out-of-pocket costs associated with 9-1-1 emergency ambulance services provided by THRS. Up to five medical assists per year are also included in your membership. Keep in mind that the subscription covers out of pocket expenses not paid by your insurance company but does not include amounts due as part of an insurance deductible. We offer multiple levels of annual subscription (shown below) to fit every type of household.

#### **Public Works**

The weather forecast is predicting snow. Should I move my car from the street? Ordinance 561 states the following: "It will be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, whether principal or agent, to park any motors vehicles on any public street within the Township during the period of time commencing after snow begins to fall and ending 72 hours after the cessation of a snowstorm."

When is my street going to be plowed? The streets are plowed in order of priority. Main roads are plowed first, secondary roads next, and then all development roads. Please be patient with the process; once the snow has ceased, it takes an average of 6-8 hours to plow and two hours to salt the Township's roads.



I shoveled my sidewalk and driveway and you plowed me in. Why? When cleaning your street, one half of the street is cleared to the curb in each direction. This creates the unavoidable problem of cleaned sidewalks and driveways being covered with snow. The best solution to avoid this situation is to wait until the streets have been cleared before cleaning driveways and sidewalks.

\*Please do not shovel snow from driveways into the roadway Not only is this hazardous but it's also illegal and can result in a fine.

My mailbox was damaged by the snow plow. Who do I contact? Contact the Public Works Department at (215) 355-3433. Here's how the process works:

- If it is determined that a plow hit the mailbox, the Township will provide a temporary mailbox until it can be fixed. If the mailbox cannot be fixed, the property owner can choose to either purchase (receipts necessary) or have the Township purchase materials to replace the mailbox and/or post up to a value of \$60.
- If it is determined that the mailbox was knocked down by snow being expelled from the plow, it's the property owner's responsibility to fix it.

Please note that mailbox damages must be reported within 48 hours.

I've trimmed my trees in my backyard. Where can I dispose of them? The Township has a contract with J.P.Mascaro to pick up yard waste. From April 1 through December 15, yard waste is picked up the day after your regular trash collection day. Check out our Yard Waste & Leaf Collection page for full details.

There is a dog running loose around the neighborhood. Who should I call? Contact the Police Department at (215) 357-8700.

When will the streets be swept? Streets are swept annually beginning in April.

The detention basin is not draining? Contact the Public Works Department at (215) 357-6800.

## Trash & Recycling



**Who is responsible for trash collection?** The Township has a contract with J.P. Mascaro & Sons for solid waste services. You can contact their customer service department at 800-432-1616.

There's a snowstorm coming. Is trash going to be picked up? Collection will occur during inclement weather unless cancelled by J. P. Mascaro. We will then announce the cancellation on our website. Should J. P. Mascaro cancel a scheduled collection due to a weather event, then collection will occur the next day. All areas of the township will also be collected one day late for the rest of the week if a cancellation occurs.

# What is the holiday schedule for trash/recycling?

- New Year's Day
- Memorial Day

What is the trash collection schedule when there's a holiday? Please note the following changes in your trash collection schedule for a holiday:

- If your trash collection day is Monday, then it'll be picked up Tuesday.
- If your trash collection day is Tuesday, then it'll be picked up Wednesday.
- If your trash collection day is Thursday, then it'll be picked up Friday.

**When is yard waste collected?** From April 1 through December 15, yard waste is picked up the day after your scheduled trash collection day.

- If your trash collection day is Monday, then it'll be picked up Tuesday.
- If your trash collection day is Tuesday, then it'll be picked up Wednesday.
- If your trash collection day is Thursday, then it'll be picked up Friday.

## From the Building and Codes Department

At their August 22nd meeting, the Board of Supervisors passed an ordinance regulating bamboo based upon requests by Township residents. Specifically, the planting of bamboo is now prohibited unless there is strict compliance containing the root system and preventing encroachment onto neighboring properties, Township property, roads, and sidewalks.

Of particular concern are the properties that currently have existing bamboo. Under the new ordinance, these properties must now contain the growth subject to specific criteria outlined in the ordinance. In addition, this containment must not allow future encroachment onto neighboring properties.

The Bucks County Commissioners and the Bucks County Emergency Communications Department have partnered with Smart911 to begin a new program that will allow for quicker assistance when a 9-1-1 call is placed. Individuals can now sign up for free online and give pertinent information on themselves and their family which will allow 9-1-1 operators to

dispatch law enforcement, fire and emergency medical services quicker and with more relevant data.

Residents can now create an account at https://www.smart911.com/smart911/ref/login.action?pa=buckscounty with basic contact information. Once the account has been activated, the profile can be customized and residents can share as little or as much as they would like emergency response to have in the event of emergency. The information is only viewable by dispatchers and other emergency personnel when a 9-1-1 call is placed, otherwise it remains safe and secure in the safety profile.

"If your elderly father with Alzheimer's and a history of wandering lives with you, adding his photo to Smart911 allows dispatchers to distribute that photo to emergency personnel as soon as you call 9-1-1," said Audrey Kenny, Director of Bucks County Emergency Communications. "If your daughter has a severe peanut allergy, adding that medical information to Smart911 could give precious moments to the Emergency Medical personnel who won't have to ask as many questions before beginning treatment."

Another major benefit to Smart911 is their partnership with RapidSOS. Each year, roughly 180 million mobile calls are placed to 9-1-1, and over 10,000 lives are lost when those mobile customers cannot be located, according to the FCC. Adding a home address, work address, possibly a church or community center where free time is spent, allows the caller to simply use their cell phone to say "I am home" or even "I am three blocks from work coming from home" and the dispatcher who has the address information can relay it to emergency personnel. RapidSOS takes it one step further. This new system works with the Emergency Communications software to further narrow down the caller's location on a mobile phone. RapidSOS uses a nationwide Location Information Server (LIS) to deliver more precise coordinates and faster service. In some situations, RapidSOS can get emergency personnel to callers up to five minutes faster, which could dramatically alter the outcomes of crises.

Bucks County residents are encouraged to create their Safety Profile with Smart911 today to have their information immediately available to 9-1-1 and first responders.

#### **SNOW AND MAILBOX DAMAGE**

Northampton Township Public Works Crews pay close attention to avoid mailboxes in the right-ofway. Mailboxes are rarely hit by plows, however a mailbox with a weakened support may be toppled by the snow rolling off the end of the snowplow which is not an approvable claim.

Under Northampton Township's Mailbox Replacement Policy, repairs and/or reimbursements are limited by the Township only when a snowplow directly hits a mailbox or post. The policy specifically states that the Township is not responsible for damage cause by "plowed snow" coming off of the trucks plow.

The Public Works Department is asking homeowners to inspect and evaluate the condition of their mailbox and its support prior to the onset of winter weather. The mailboxes and the posts that support them may require maintenance or replacement. Residents should make sure mailboxes are firmly attached to the post and the post is constructed sturdily enough to withstand the weight of the snow as it comes off the end of the snowplow. Homeowners should also check the placement of their mailbox to ensure that it is not leaning into the street.



Residents are also reminded that they are responsible for clearing their mailbox area of snow to ensure mail delivery.

#### What To Do If Your Mailbox Is Damaged

In the event that your mailbox is damaged during snow removal operations you should do the following:

- Take photos of the damaged mailbox
- Complete the Mailbox Damage Form. This form can be found under the Documents & Forms section of the Township website: www.northamptontownship.com. The form can be submitted via email receptionist@nhtwp.org , fax to 215-357-1251, or drop it off to the Administration Building located at 55 Township Road, Richboro, Pa 18954.
- The Public Works will either repair the existing mailbox or pay for a replacement.
- Under the mailbox replacement policy the maximum reimbursement for repairs is \$60.00. The policy also states the Township
  will not be responsible to replace ornamental mailboxes, or to repair any lawn areas outside the road right-of-way.

# MEMORIES OF THE RICHBORO NIKE BASE by James M. Briggs

The announcement by the Army in 1954 that a military base was going to be built in bucolic Richboro startled most local residents at the time. None more than my Aunt and Uncle who had just purchased a 1/2 acre lot in Richboro. Their plans did not include having missiles 1/2 mile from their future home.

The Army to "inform" the nearby citizens did several meetings at the old firehouse in Richboro. But there were few outcries as this was a much different era. The U.S. was combating Communism throughout the World and everyone was expected to do their part.

It is difficult for someone not of this time to realize how rural Northampton Township was then. The population just over 2,000 had actually decreased slightly between the two World Wars. This was attributable to mechanization reducing the number of farm laborers required to work the fields.

There were few facilities for social interaction in Richboro at this time beside Luff and Traub general store (now Sunoco), the Spread Eagle Inn, and a small candy store just north on Second Street Pike. Originally there had been bus service stopping in Richboro. But this was discontinued by the construction of the Nike Base leaving only the Churchville Train station as available mass transit.

Most soldiers did not have cars, so the local Addisville Reformed Church initiated a program with the Nike Base. Church members would have an individual soldier for Sunday afternoon and then provide dinner with their families. I still remember one such visitor would do magic tricks amusing my brothers and myself.

The Army did try to maintain contact with the local population by conducting guided tours with local Boy Scouts, school groups, etc. These were usually limited in scope unlike the annual "Open House". I remember the excitement of seeing a Nike missile rise to the surface from its underground home and elevating to a launching position.

The Base operations minimally affected the local population. All provisions were trucked in and the only outside activity was the necessity of busing the soldiers between the two sites. I rode by the base hundreds of times while attending the high school in Newtown and the only daily change was a different soldier at the main entrance guardhouse. My grandmother did experience hearing difficulties while sitting outside during visits to Richboro. The radar on Twining Ford Road caused periodic interference with her hearing aid as the unit swept the sky.

In 1957 the first shopping center was built off Bustleton Pike and the "Wishing Well" luncheonette (now Jake's Eatery') was the first establishment. This did give the soldiers some local place to socialize away from the base. Unfortunately I can remember one evening when three soldiers entered the restaurant while I was there with my family. The obviously drunken Sergeant around me lamenting his distant family and son my age. This did not thrill my father ( a former U.S. Army Captain) who quickly extricated me from this situation.

The Richboro Nike Base was just one part of the "Cold War" which permeated the country during this era. Even school children practiced "duck and cover" drills in case of a nuclear attack along with the normal fire ones. The Township was prepared with a supply of Civil Defense rations at the Villa Joseph Marie H.S. I attended classes in Doylestown to become a "Radiological Monitor" while working for Northampton Township. Hopefully you have enjoyed a brief glimpse into an era and our Township's small role in that history.




