Yard Waste Collection

April 1 – December 15: Unlimited yard waste will be collected the day after your trash day.

Yard waste will only be collected in cans or biodegradable bags. Be sure the bags do not weigh more than 50 pounds when full. Biodegradable bags can be purchased at the administration building for \$.40 each or in bundles of 50 for \$20.

Tree branches and shrubbery must be no more than 36 inches long and less than 3 inches in diameter. They must be bundled and tied, taped or put in biodegradable bags. Branches and shrubbery cannot extend over the top of the can.

Fireworks: Frequently Asked Questions

Recent changes to the laws regulating fireworks have caused a considerable increase in complaints and questions regarding their appropriate use. House Bill 542 was signed into law on October 30, 2017. Under the new law, residents over the age of 18 can now purchase and use "Class C" or consumer-grade fireworks. These include fire crackers, Roman candles bottle rockets and similar fireworks that contain a maximum of 50 milligrams of explosive material. Display fireworks (the type used at commercial fireworks displays) or US DOT 1.3 material are still regulated by Federal, State and local laws. Residents choosing to utilize consumer fireworks are reminded that not all your neighbors or their pets share your enthusiasm. In fact, many pets are traumatized by them. Please note the following regulations for the use of fireworks in Northampton Township.

- Fireworks can only be purchased and used by persons over 18 years of age.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged on a public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged from or within a motor vehicle or structure.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged toward a motor vehicle or structure.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged within 150 feet of an occupied structure.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged by a person who is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance or another drug.

Residents are cautioned that fireworks should not be used during dry periods or windy conditions. Please be aware of your neighbors and limit your use of these materials accordingly. Residents are reminded that the townships noise ordinance generally restricts objectionable noises between the hours of 10:00 PM and 7:00 AM Monday through Saturday, and 10:00 PM and 8:00 AM on Sunday. Remember, we all live here.



Electronics Waste

If you are planning on doing some Spring cleaning of your garage or basement remember: **Don't kick that TV to the curb**!

Televisions, along with computers and some other electronics (covered devices), can no longer be disposed of with the municipal waste under the Covered Devices Recycling Act of 2010. Listed are several locations to drop off your television, and companies that will come to pick up your television for recycling. Please confirm with each company for their list of fees and conditions prior to dropping off your television.

Planning and Zoning Corner

The following is multi-part series on the planning and zoning process. In each issue, we will focus on a particular area in order to better help you understand the documents, process, and terms that guide planning and zoning in Northampton Township. This month we will focus on the *Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code* (often referred to as the *MPC*).


WHAT IS THE MPC?

The MPC is the State legislation that guides planning and zoning in Pennsylvania. It is adopted by the State legislature and signed into law. In simple terms, it provides the authority for municipalities, such as Northampton Township, to plan and zone. It is a very thorough document that contains procedures and requirements related to the following:

- · Requirements related to the Planning Commission;
- Adopting a Comprehensive Plan and the items it must contain;
- Adopting Zoning and Subdivision and Land Development Ordinances and making ordinance changes;
- Requirements related to processing Subdivision and Land Development applications;
- Processing Zoning Hearing Board applications and the function of the Board.

WHO PAYS TO RESTORE MY BROKEN OUTDOOR WATER OR SEWER LINES?

Many homeowners have the misconception that their local water or sewer provider is responsible for the water service line and sewer lateral line on their property. Contrary to this belief, the water and sewer lines that service your property are actually yours, and you are responsible for them. Many homeowners who are part of an association have a similar misconception that they are not responsible for their lines, but they very well may be. Unfortunately, many homeowners only learn this when they find themselves having a major problem.

On occasion, water companies will mail letters offering homeowners coverage on their outside lines. The homeowners inevitably react, and call their insurance company or their property manager to find out if this is already covered. Unfortunately, coverage on the external water and sewer lines is rarely–if ever–the case. Typically, insurance pays to restore an insured building or structure for damage caused by an insurable event (fire, water, smoke, etc.) In other words, insurance companies might pay for the damage the broken water line causes to your home, but not the repair of the broken line itself. In a homeowner's association, water and sewer lines are often considered "Limited Common Elements." If a limited common element only services one home, then that homeowner is likely responsible for the repair of the limited common element.

To summarize, the responsibility of the broken pipe lies with the homeowner in most cases. You may be thinking, "OK, I'm responsible...so now what?" There are a couple of options available. If your water or sewer provider offers coverage, you can purchase it through them. Please check with a water or sewer authority to see if they have an alternative such as **BCWSA's \$afeGuard™Water & Sewer Maintenance Program**. This maintenance program offers a broader protection than the standard coverage offered by a water company. It is **also available to Non-BCWSA customers in Bucks County & Montgomery County.** For more information, please go to our website www.bcwsa.net or call 215-343-2538 ext.140. Northampton Township Police Department

Recent events in Parkland Florida have brought to the forefront concerns about school safety. The Northampton Township Police Department, your police department, wants to assure our community that your police are well trained and ready to address any emergency situation within our schools. The intention of this article is to share information with the community regarding many measures the police department utilizes that may not be commonly known.

The police department has an officer assigned to the high school, full-time, as a School Resource Officer (SRO). The officer assigned is woven into the fabric of the school community; he is more than a mere presence or symbol. The SRO is integrated into school curriculum by making classroom presentations. The officer is a ready resource for professional and support staff bringing the officer's brand of expertise into conversations about school climate. The officer participates in the Council Rock Coalition for Healthy Youth (CRCHY). CRCHY offers stakeholders from various community organizations the opportunity to meet, discuss, and identify remedies to high risk behaviors of our children.

Last month, the SRO successfully completed a rigorous interactive training program, tailored specifically to school police officers. The training assessed how the officer responded, observed, oriented and acted under stress to school specific incidents. Our patrol officers are in the process of completing similar training. Many of our officers have already completed this comprehensive training program.

Our patrol officers routinely perform safety checks at our elementary and middle schools by parking their cars in front of schools, walking the hallways, and meeting with school staff. This requirement is a long standing operations policy for Northampton officers. The "Adopt A Cop" program has officers going in schools to make presentations in classrooms or just stopping by to visit. This interaction presents opportunities for students, staff, and officers to build positive rapport. Building relationships and partnerships creates an atmosphere where staff and students feel comfortable bringing concerns to the officer which helps to keep the community and our schools safe.

While the department has a strong emphasis on prevention and mitigation of emergency incidents in our schools, we have an equal emphasis on response to and elimination of threats to our school population.

The Police department is a member of the South Central SWAT team. Our Emergency Response Team conducts drills and training to keep the members proficient in all aspects of response to emergency situations. Designated officers from our police department serve on the SWAT team as tactical officers, crisis negotiators, and tactical emergency medical officers. Before being promoted into our current positions within the department, Lieutenant LeCompte and I served a number of leadership roles within the SWAT Team. We both have years of tactical and de-escalation experience and have a vested interest in the SWAT Team and our officers remaining proficient in the tactical response to emergencies.

Our police cars are equipped with a computer system that allows officers' access to the security camera system of the High School in the event of an emergency. Our headquarters operations room personnel have similar access to the camera system for emergencies. Our police also have the ability to speak directly with school personnel through our police radio system. This technology allows the police to have real time viewing of an event so we can quickly deploy arriving officers and have up to date information to instantly address any threat to the safety of the school community. Arriving officers will immediately enter a school and move to quickly eliminate the threat in an effort to preserve life.

The Northampton Township Police Department stands ready and committed to respond to any emergency situation within our school and has additional training scheduled for our officers. We do however need the assistance of the school community. Please remain attentive to changes in behaviors of students and staff, and report concerning postings on social media and rumors. Notify the police, a trusted teacher, support staff or school administrator of potential problems. If you see or hear something, please say something. Together we enhance the security of our schools.

Twin Trees

Richard Leedom Sr., a Northampton resident in the mid 1700s, owned a store and a grist mill as well as the Black Bear, a tavern located at the intersection that we know as Bustleton Pike and Second Street Pike. The village was actually known as Leedomville for a period of time. Leedom lived in quarters above the tavern; however, in 1779 he purchased a small house located across the street on Second Street Pike. He expanded the original house by building a beautiful two story fieldstone structure, as well as additional buildings including a wagon house, smoke house, grainery and outhouse. The original home is thought to have been built circa 1740 to 1760 by a Quaker carpenter named Isaac Watson.

It is believed that The Committee of Correspondence held meetings in this house prior to the drawing up of the U.S. Constitution. It is also thought to have housed a general store and it was probably the site of Richboro's first Post Office. There were two buttonwood trees in the side lawn and a pair of chestnut trees in the front lawn, doubtlessly leading to the property being known as Twin Trees.

On June 5, 1975, Twin Trees was placed on the National Register of Historic Places, our nation's catalog of historically and architecturally significant sites and structures. Entry upon the National Register gives recognition to the historical and/or architectural merits of the structure.

The original section of the house was built of rough field stone as was common at the time. A large walk in fireplace containing a beehive oven for cooking and a door for the passage of firewood continue to be focal points in the keeping room. Built-in cabinetry and a large stone sink are also keeping room features of the old house. The second floor had two rooms. One room with a small fireplace is thought to have been the "borning room." Random width pine floor boards throughout the original house and its 1779 addition were hand hewn and secured with hand wrought nails.

The two story farmhouse addition built in 1779 has ceilings which reach a towering 9' 6". The first and second floors, connected by a beautiful wooden staircase, have two rooms on each side of a center hall. Eight fireplaces are in this addition totaling ten in the entire historic structure. The deep basement provided cold storage and there is also a cold vault outside for food preservation.

A ladder in the attic gave access to a door in the cedar roof in case of fire. Scorched timbers in the basement would suggest that there was a fire at some point, not uncommon due to the numerous fireplaces needed to heat homes of that period.

All of this history lives behind the walls of the Campbell and Thomas Funeral Home in Richboro.




