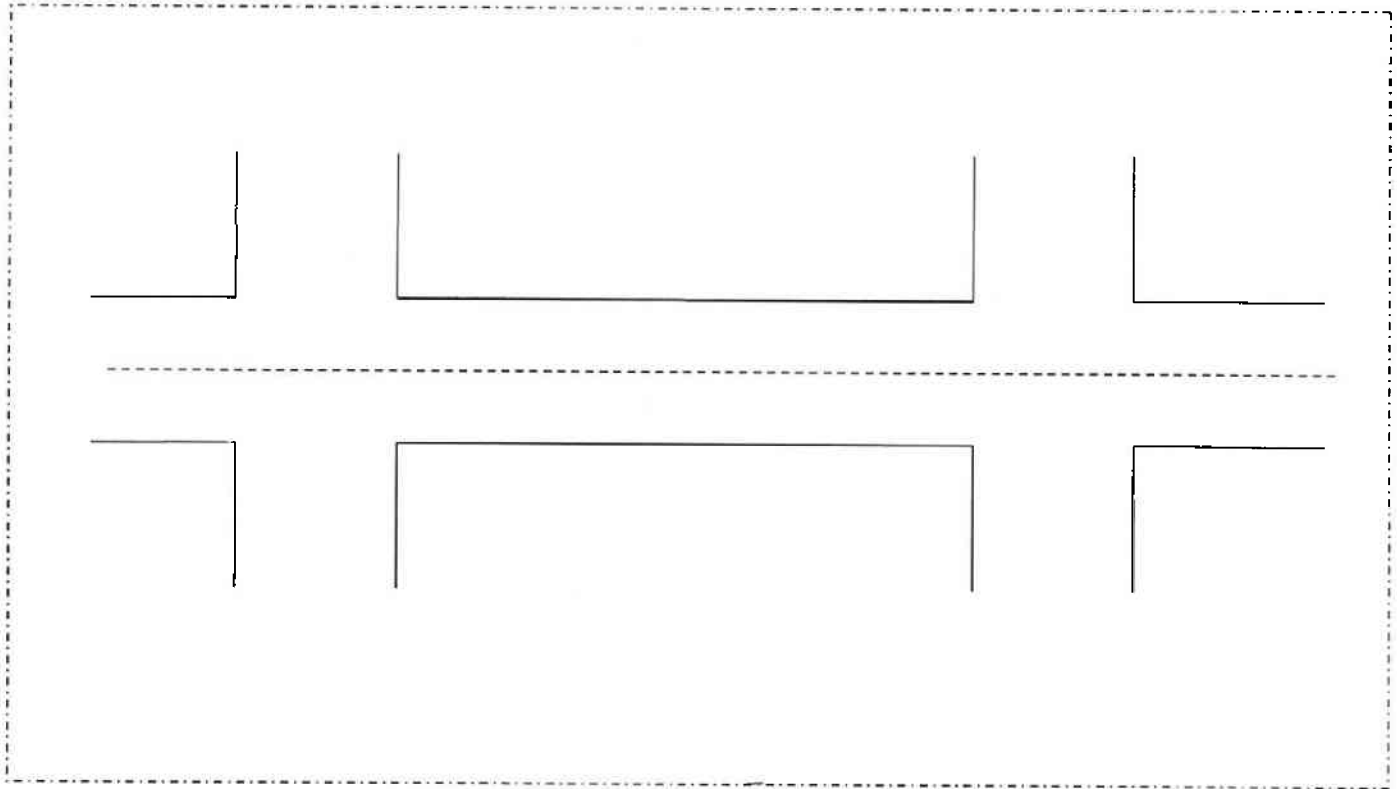

Notes:

1. Permittee to show all dimensions.
2. Permittee to show all curb, sidewalk, storm sewer, swales and driveways.
3. Permittee to show all proposed improvements including widths, pipe sizes and trench locations.
4. Permittee to show any pertinent information such as road widths, obstruction or unusual situations.
5. Driveway pipes to be minimum 18 inch diameter and are to extend at least one foot beyond each side of driveway.
6. Swales to conform to present ditch line, so as not to restrict flow of surface water.
7. Temporary pavement restoration to be completed at the end of each work day.
8. Permanent restoration (roadway and unimproved area) to be completed within 60 days.
