PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/MOMENT OF SILENCE

Chairman Selisker led the Pledge of Allegiance and held a moment of silence in support of military and emergency services personnel.

CHAIRMAN ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chairman Selisker announced the donation for the Library from Wheelabrator Inc., will take place at a future meeting and has been removed from tonight's agenda.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was none.

CONSENT ITEMS

MINUTES

The Board meeting minutes of April 27, 2022 were approved by unanimous consent.

ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

The accounts payable for May 11, 2022, for \$873,980.22 and, for May 25, 2022, for \$719,794.54 were approved by unanimous consent.

Mrs. Gasper stated for the record that her family business, Gasper Landscaping, has had landscaping maintenance contracts with the Township As a result, she wanted to let everyone know that she will be abstaining from all votes to approve any accounts payable list that includes a payment to Gasper Landscaping.

Consider Planning Module Resolution R-22-1B, Green Tree Contracting Group, LLC.

Mr. Moore explained the subdivision at Advent Church on Worthington Mill Road was recently approved. As they progress forward to ultimately begin construction, a planning module must be sent to DEP to allow connection to public sewer. As part of that process, a resolution must be passed by the Board of Supervisors.

A copy of the resolution was provided to the Board for their review.

A consent motion was made by Chairman Selisker that the DEP resolution R-22-1B for Plan Revision for new Land Development be approved for Green Tree Group Contracting LLC for the Advent Church Subdivision.

The motion was approved by unanimous consent.

NEW BUSINESS

Consider Preliminary/Final Plan of Land Development, Dunkin Donuts, SLD 2022, 960 Second Street Pike

Mr. Moore asked the representatives from Dunkin Donuts to introduce themselves as follows:

Kellie McGowan, of Obermayer, Attorney for the applicant, Joe Young, Operator and Developer for the project, and Joe Young Jr., 232 Investments, LLC. For the Second Street Pike Location.

Mr. Moore outlined and explained the project is located along the west side of Second Street Pike, approximately 500 feet southwest of its intersection with Almshouse Road. The proposal is to consolidate three parcels to form a .99-acre site and construct a 4,290 square foot commercial building with related driveways and parking. The proposed building contains a 2,115 square foot carry out restaurant with drive-thru service (proposed as a Dunkin Donuts) and a 2,175 square foot retail/office space. All existing structures are to be removed. Public water and sewer serve the site.

The subject property is zoned C-2 – General Commercial/Office District in the Village Overlay, which allows the use by-right on a minimum lot area of 15,000 square feet, a minimum lot width of 75 feet, a minimum front yard setback of 20 feet, and a maximum front yard setback of 40 feet.

On December 17, 2021, the Zoning Hearing Board granted the following variances:

1. To reduce the width of the rear buffer yard that abuts residentially zoned lands to 17.9 feet instead of 20 feet and to allow parking spaces in the rear buffer yard;

- 2. To allow 32 off-street parking spaces rather than the required 42 to serve both proposed uses (carry-out restaurant and retail/office);
- To permit the off-street parking spaces to be setback 3 feet from the front lot line, and 6.2 feet from the northern side lot line, where the required minimum parking space setback is 15 feet from any property line;
- 4. To allow the drive-thru pay and pick-up windows to be along the side wall of the new building instead of the rear side; and,
- 5. To permit the parking area to utilize less than 5 percent of its area as landscaping.

At their meeting on May 10, 2022, the Township Planning Commission recommended approval of the plan.

A motion was made and seconded (Moore-Rose) to approve the Preliminary/Final approval of the Dunkin Donuts Land Development, SLD 22-2, located at 960 Second Street Pike, subject to compliance with the Township Engineer's review letter dated May 2, 2022, the Township Planner's review letter dated May 2, 2022, and the Township Traffic Engineer's review letter dated May 3, 2022. It is also recommended that the requested waivers be granted. In addition, approval is subject to the following:

- 1. The applicant shall enter into a land development agreement and escrow agreement in a form acceptable to the Township solicitor and engineer. This shall include a stormwater management maintenance and operations agreement.
- 2. A Park and Recreation Impact fee of \$7,539 is required. The fee shall be payable per the terms of the land development agreement.
- 3. The Township shall have final review and approval of building architectural renderings to ensure compliance with the Village Overlay District requirements.
- 4. Signage is not part of this approval. A separate permit submission must be made.
- 5. The applicant shall install two (2) Village Overlay streetlights as outlined in the Township engineer's review letter.
- 6. The applicant shall cooperate with the Township if there is a future connection to the Addisville Commons connector road. The Township Solicitor shall incorporate specific language in the development agreement.
- 7. The applicant is responsible for obtaining any outside approvals that may be necessary, including, but not limited to, DEP, the Conservation District, PennDOT, and the Municipal Authority. Further, approval is granted for submission of any documents that may be required as part of the sewage facilities planning process.
- 8. All conditions and recommendations incorporated with the motion and minutes are subject to the Township Solicitor's approval letter.

Chairman Selisker called for Board comment.

The Board unanimously agreed this project is a welcomed addition to the Township.

Chairman Selisker called for public comment. None was heard.

Motion passed 5-0.

Consider Bids for Traffic Signal Improvements-Second Street Pike and New Road

Mr. Salzer stated the bids were opened on May 17, 2022, for traffic signal improvements at the intersection of Second Street Pike and New Road. The Township received three bids for the project that include installation of a new controller cabinet, pedestrian countdown signals and pushbuttons, dilemma zone protection, a battery backup system, and video detection.

The Township received a \$100,560 PennDOT Green-Light-Go Program grant for these improvements. They are intended to improve motorist and pedestrian safety and increase the efficiency of the traffic signal to more effectively move traffic through the intersection

The three bids received are as follows:

Armour & Sons, Electric, Inc.	\$102,585.00
Car & Duff, Inc.	\$112,967.00
Miller Brothers, Inc.	\$139 <i>,</i> 855.11

The Township has a 20% matching requirement of approximately 20,0000.

A motion was made and seconded (Salzer-Gasper) to award a bid to Armour and Sons Electric, Inc. for \$102,585 for various traffic signal improvements at Second Street Pike and New Road, and to authorize the Township Manager to execute all documents required to implement the signal improvement project

Chairman Selisker called for Board and public comment. None was heard.

Motion Passed 5-0.
