SWIMMING POOLS

With Summer upon us, now is the perfect time to check the safety features of your swimming pools. Check the fencing and gates around the pool for any needed repairs. In addition, if house doors lead directly to the pool area, door alarms are required that comply with building code standards.

Please also be advised that the pool industry has rapidly changed over the past few years. Now, above ground pools can be easily purchased at many stores. Although they are easy to install for homeowners, they are still subject to permits and compliance with all codes.

HISTORICAL COMMISSION CORNER

THEN AND NOW

Northampton Township was always a farming community, with just a few settlements near crossroads or mills. Not until the late 1800's did the villages of Richboro and Churchville grow, as retired farmers decided to build homes "in town."

Did you know that Richboro had many names in the past: Addisville, Leedomville, and even Beartown? Now a bustling thoroughfare, Richboro was once a small but busy village of farmers and shopkeepers with homes, churches and schools that remain standing in our midst to this day. Look at this and see if you can recognize Richboro of a century ago!



Rte. 232 and 332 Intersection This 1907 photograph was taken from the middle of 2nd Street Pike looking north; standing near what is now the Sunoco Station. The tavern to the left is the Spread Eagle Inn; the farmland to the right is now the Richboro Shopping Plaza.



The Spread Eagle Inn, was built in 1810 by Enoch Addis as a "... commodious house for a Tavern." Originally the White Bear Tavern, it was one of two purveyors of food and drink located in the heart of Richboro. Later named the Spread Eagle Inn, the building was relocated to its present site in 2001.

WHAT IS THE SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE?



The following is multi-part series on the planning and zoning process. In each issue, we will focus on a particular area in order to better help you understand the documents, process, and terms that guide planning and zoning in Northampton Township. This month we will focus on the Northampton Township Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance.

What is the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance?

As discussed in a previous edition, the Zoning Ordinance outlines setbacks, minimum lot areas, lot coverage requirements, permitted uses, parking requirements, and other criteria. The Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance contains more specific design standards, such as the following:

- street design requirements, including cartway & paving width
- sidewalk design standards
- lighting requirements
- grading, drainage, and erosion and sediment control

- parking lot design requirements
- administrative provisions related to processing subdivision and development applications

Unlike variance requests from the Zoning Ordinance which go before the Zoning Hearing Board, waiver requests from the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance go before the Board of Supervisors.
