Real ID - Deadline is Approaching!

Don't wait! The deadline to obtain your Real ID is fast approaching. Beginning May 7, 2025, a REAL ID or other federally accepted identification, such as a valid U.S. passport, will be required to:

- · Board domestic flights.
- Enter military bases.
- · Access certain federal facilities.

To acquire a REAL ID, residents must visit a PennDOT Driver's License Center and provide:

- Proof of identity (e.g., birth certificate or passport).
- Proof of Social Security number.
- Two proofs of current Pennsylvania address.
- Proof of all legal name changes (if applicable).

Cost:

- A one-time fee of \$30 plus the standard renewal fee of \$30.50.
- The REAL ID will be valid for four years plus any remaining time on your current license.

Note: Obtaining a REAL ID is optional. You can continue to use your standard Pennsylvania driver's license for driving, voting, accessing federal benefits, and visiting hospitals, post offices, or federal courts.



Traffic Safety Signs available at Northampton Township Police Department

Our goal is to make our roadways safe through educating drivers, enforcing traffic laws, conducting traffic studies, and promoting infrastructure improvements to reduce hazards. We also participate in some self and state funded initiatives that focus on Occupant Safety, Aggressive Driving, Pedestrian Safety, Operation Safe Stop, and DUI enforcement.

Any resident that would like to partner with our department to promote traffic safety in their neighborhood can request one of our two traffic safety yard signs, pictured to the side, at our headquarters. Supplies of each sign may be limited.







The Northampton Township Police Department wants to remind motorists of the Pennsylvania **Move Over Law**.

Drivers must move over or slow down for all first responders, including police, fire, and ambulance crews, as well as stopped tow trucks and maintenance vehicles. The law's purpose is to keep emergency responders and service vehicle operators safe.

Failure to move over or slow down will result in a citation that carries a fine of \$500 for first time offenders, \$1,000 for a second offense, and \$2,000 and a 90-day license suspension for a third or subsequent offense. Penalties are increased for incidents that seriously injure or kill another person.

The Pennsylvania Move Over Law mandates specific actions from drivers when approaching an emergency response area. It requires drivers to move over to a lane further away from the emergency response area if safe to do so. If moving over is not possible or safe, the law demands drivers to slow down considerably. An emergency response area is where an emergency vehicle has its lights flashing, or where road crews or emergency responders have lighted flares, posted signs, or try to warn travelers. Help us keep our first responders safe.



Northampton Township Police Fight Fraud

We are doing everything we can to prevent you from being a victim of fraud, but scammers can be clever and persistent in their pursuit to commit fraud. Recently, our residents were targeted with a scam where the scammer spoofed their phone number to make it appear that our police department was calling and the caller identified himself as one of our police officers. The caller alleged that the victim failed to appear for jury duty and would now need to pay a fee to avoid being arrested. Victim was told to transfer funds via Bitcoin.

If you think you are being targeted by a scammer call someone you trust or the Northampton Township Police Department non-emergency number at (215) 357-8700 before you do anything, especially before you make any transactions.

Seniors are commonly targeted with scams such as: romance scams, tech support scams, grandparent scams, sweepstakes and lottery scams, home repair scams, and more. Older adults lose more than 36 billion in financial fraud every year. These scams have all occurred in Northampton Township.

The brick will be revealed at the annual Veterans Ceremony see the Township Website for details as the event draws near.



Pennsylvania One Call

Frequently, our department receives phone calls from residents about paint markings on the roadway or lawn area in front of their house. What exactly are these marks and what do the colors mean? It is all related to a Pennsylvania One Call.

Whenever there is excavation or digging, it is the law that a Pennsylvania One Call must be made by dialing 8-1-1. When this call is made, all utility companies come out and identify their particular utility by color. For example, water is blue, electric is red, cable is orange, etc. Due to the frequency of requests for service, many of these calls are related to the cable companies.

The marks that you see are the locations of these particular utilities. In many cases, they are in the roadway itself. Many other times, however, the utilities are located in the right-of-way adjacent to the curb. Township and State right-of-ways extend beyond the roadway and curb. In most residential developments, the right-of-way extends 10 feet beyond the curb. In response to many questions that we receive, the markings are not on private property, but rather in the right-of-way that is designated for these utilities. In addition, there are often easements that run through private property to carry utilities as well.


If you have any questions, feel free to contact the Building and Codes Department at 215-355-3883. Most importantly, if you are doing ANY digging or excavation on your property, you are required to make a Pennsylvania One Call by dialing 8-1-1. It can prevent major problems with a simple phone call. It's also the law!

A MESSAGE FROM PUBLIC WORKS

2025 Paving Schedule

Northampton Township's Public Works Department is pleased to announce the 2025 paving schedule, which includes a range of road improvement projects to enhance safety and driving conditions. Road maintenance typically occurs in August, although the exact timing varies depending on weather conditions and other Township maintenance projects.

This year's program features roads slated for milling and overlay, paving with nova-chip, and micro surfacing to extend pavement life and improve durability. These upgrades reflect our continued commitment to maintaining the township's infrastructure and ensuring smooth travel for residents and visitors alike.

When performing the milling and overlay, the top layer of asphalt is removed with a milling machine and then the full width of the road is repaved. The micro-surfacing is a heavy-duty sealer, similar to the material used on driveways but includes stone chips and is much more durable. Finally, the nova chip treatment is an ultra-thin virgin hot asphalt overlay which is used to preserve roads. The nova chip process allows for a road to be driven on immediately after compaction and does not require milling of the surface.

Free Library of Northampton Township continues to provide adult programs to maintain our Gold Star status. We have the following upcoming adult programs at the library:

Saturday, March 22 | 1:00 PM Bucks County Artifacts

Did you watch Josh Gates' Expedition Unknown episode on the Doan Gang? You may have seen the Mercer Museum and the Pennsylvania Historical Recovery Services highlighted. Jim Bongiovanni of PHRS will discuss what they do, and share stories of the artifacts that he and his colleagues have recovered, adventures they have had, and the sites from which artifacts have been recovered dating back into the late 1600s. Artifacts will be on display for you to view as well as a Q&A after the presentation. All artifacts that PHRS recovers are documented and turned over to the property owner or historical society.

Wednesday, March 26 | 1:00 PM Pysanky Egg Workshop

This presentation will focus primarily on photos and postcards of Northampton Township and

adjacent communities. Presented by Chase Palmer, native of Richboro and resident of Solebury, and author of the updated Betty Davis' 1980 Postcards of Bucks County.

The Irish in the American Civil War

The American Civil War is Ireland's forgotten conflict. In 1860, about 1.5 million Irish were living in the U.S.A. During the Civil War, some 150,000 fought in the Union Army and about 20,000 joined and fought with the Confederacy. Join returning presenter Mike Jesberger on this history presentation.

Saturday, April 5 | 1:00 PM

Play Ball: Shibe Park and Beyond

Returning presenter Rick Spector will talk about local baseball. One of our most beloved departed landmarks was the ballpark at 21st Street and Lehigh Avenue in North Philadelphia. Shibe Park/Connie Mack Stadium was home to professional baseball, football, and other major events for more than 60 years. The ballpark was a prime focus of what was once a great industrial city. Capture the magic of what it meant to live, work, and play in Philly by learning about Shibe Park. A "must see" for local sports and history buffs.

Saturday, May 10 | 1:00 PM

Gloriana: The Elizabethan World of William Shakespeare

Shakespeare lived and wrote in a time of social, political, and health upheaval. His plays both reflect and code his own turbulent times. Presented by Juliene Osborne-McKnight.

Saturday, June 14 | 1:00 PM

Stars and Stripes Forever: John Philip Sousa

Historian and actor Dr. J. Covington will depict John Philip Sousa, America's favorite March King, famous bandmaster, and composer who toured the world.

NORTHAMPTON TOWNSHIP ARCHIVES

The Northampton Township Archives, overseen by the Historical Commission, created a new exhibit for 2025 titled: Local Veteran & World War II: William Ray Shaw's Collection. Mr. Shaw was a former Northampton Township Police officer in the 1960s and his family recently donated a collection of WWII items he acquired during his military service. Check out the new exhibit and learn about the folk art of stone books.

During the month of January, Public Works worked to repurpose and install compact shelving from the former police building into the Archives storage room to allow for better storage of its collections.

The Northampton Township Historical Commission's next meeting will be on Monday, March 10, 2025, at 6:30 PM at the Free Library of Northampton Township. The Commission meets monthly on the second Monday. Residents are welcome to attend.

On this day, in history...

January 28, 1954: The Worthington Mill Covered Bridge, built in the 1870s, burned.

February 24, 1912: A devastating fire in Richboro's White Bear Hotel at the SW corner of Second Street Pike & Almshouse Road showed the community needed a fire company. Prior to establishing a volunteer fire company, Southampton Fire Company aided the community with a pumper pulled by 2 horses. Locals Stephen Gill or J. Milton Luff would meet the pumper at the township line and hitch their horse teams and race to the fire.

April 1, 1686: A 2000-acre tract was granted to English Quaker Arthur Cook, a commissioner of state, by William Penn. He never resided on the property and willed the land to his wife Margaret and son John. Clement and Thomas Dungan acquired 1,000 acres of it in 1699. Brother Jeremiah Dungan purchased 250 acres in 1711 and that parcel was sold to Gilliam Cornell in 1848. The Cornell Farm, also known as the Willow Bank Farm, located at 130 Tanyard Road or 9 Pond View, was owned by the family until the 1970s.

April 4, 1955: An illegal still was discovered on the 3rd floor of an empty farmhouse, part of the abandoned Lily Pond Farm behind Herbert Awkland's farm on Second Street Pike, near Bristol Road. The Police destroyed the still spilling liquor down through the house floors.

May 1, 1778: The Battle of Crooked Billet begins in Hatboro during the American Revolutionary War.

May 5, 1775: A group of men met at the Black Bear Tavern, Richard Leedom's house, at the intersection of Second Street Pike and Bustleton Pike on May 5, 1775. Leedom would join the Fourth Association Company and serve as a private under Captain Henry Lott.

May 16, 1907: The Arnold Brothers postcard of the White Bear Hotel was taken from its side view.

June 2, 1859: Union Cemetery, along Almshouse Road, was dedicated on this day.



STAYING SAFE in the great outdoors

Exploring the beautiful, vast Pennsylvania outdoors can be fun and memorable. However, the most important part of any trip is staying safe. In order to protect yourself and others who may exploring with you on our remote, public lands, you first need to plan out your trip and learn what to do if you need help.

Plan Your Adventure

By taking the time to plan and follow a few basic rules, a hike, camping trip, or other activity can be a safe experience you can remember with great joy for a lifetime! Here are some tips to help you plan your safe adventure:

- Always plan out your trip ahead of time. It is important to lay out your trip, including where you are going, and, if it's a multiday trip, how far you will travel each day and how long you plan to stay in each area. Plan enough time for day trips to prevent you from traveling after dark without the proper nighttime equipment.
- Always tell someone where you are going and expected time of return.
 Write down your plans and indicate on a map where you are going. Let
 them know that you will call when you return. If they do not hear from you
 they can contact the proper authorities and a search can be started. Also
 leave a copy of your plan in your vehicle, too. Do not leave your plan on the
 dash or seat, where it can be easily spotted by someone hoping to break
 into vehicles.
- <u>Don't rely on your cell phone; take a paper map with you.</u> Cell phones and GPS units are not reliable in remote areas. You may experience a drained battery or no cellular reception. A compass is also a helpful tool that is a perfect companion to your map.
- <u>Bring other helpful gear.</u> Take matches, a knife, a whistle, food, and water with you. Also remember to always dress properly for the outdoors.
- Follow your plan. When you're on your adventure, stay on designated trails and learn what trail markings indicate the trail you need to be on.

If You Need Help

If you need help, do not wait to call for help. If you are calling for help for yourself using a cell phone, dial 911. If there is no 911 service, you will need to know the specific number to call or you will need to call someone you know to call help for you.

If You Become Lost

- <u>Remain calm.</u> While this sounds easy, many people will panic when in an undesirable, unfamiliar situation. Remaining calm will help a lost individual make sound, rational decisions.
- <u>Stop walking.</u> Walking with unfamiliar landmarks will often lead someone who is lost to wander in circles and potentially cause a longer rescue time.
- <u>Seek/build shelter and a fire depending on weather conditions.</u> Staying warm and dry are two key elements to surviving an extended period in the wild. Preventing hypothermia -- a condition where your body core temperature is too low to sustain your health is critical. Learn about hypothermia and ways to avoid it before you ever become lost in the woods.

As a last resort -- if no one knows your whereabouts, if you do not have the means to stay warm, and if you are at a point of last resort, find a stream and follow the water downstream. All streams in Pennsylvania will eventually lead to a road.
