

# Chairman's Message

# **LET'S BE SUMMER SAFE!**

Dear Neighbors,

School is out and the nice weather has arrived! Hot and humid weather brings the inevitable summer thunderstorms. Occasionally these storms can be serious and cause moderate to severe damage in our Township, including downed trees, prolonged power outages and flooded roadways. We recently experienced one of these storms in mid-June.

Planning ahead is the key to minimizing the impact of these storms. A power outage may disrupt communications, well water and transportation. Here are some tips to consider if the power is out for an extended period:

- Keep freezers and refrigerators closed. Have a few days of non-perishable food on hand. A power outage will affect the grocery stores too.
- Do not go near any down wires. They may be energized. And never drive around barricades!
- Use a generator, but ONLY outdoors and at least 20 feet away from windows, doors and attached garages to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Disconnect appliances and electronics to avoid damage from electrical surges.
- Have alternate plans for refrigerating medicines or when using power-dependent medical devices such as oxygen systems. Plan ahead!
- The Township Library and Senior Center are great places to go to stay cool or charge your phones if your air conditioning is out due to a power outage.
- Go to ready, gov for more information on how to prepare for severe storms and loss of power. Be prepared!

The nice weather also brings lots of outdoor activities. Biking is a favorite. Electric bikes, electric scooters, and similar electric powered vehicles have grown in popularity. These vehicles are often seen being operated in our township, sometimes by young children. Some children may not be mature enough to understand the dangers associated with operating this type of vehicle, as well as the potential violations of Pennsylvania law.

Parents should carefully consider the risks to their children and others before purchasing a recreational electric vehicle. The Northampton Township Police Department, working with all Police Departments in Council Rock School District have created a flyer to be used as a resource for parents that may have questions about the operation of these vehicles and possible legal consequences (see page 11). # From the Building and Codes Department . . .

Summer is a great time of year to focus on preventative maintenance that keeps your basement dry. Clogged gutters and downspouts should be cleaned. Leaves and debris are a major cause of leaks and dampness at basement walls.

Downspouts should also be extended away from the house without discharging on any street or neighboring property. In addition, all mulch and shrubs should be below the top of the foundation walls.

# **Pedestrian & Crosswalk Safety**



### **General Pedestrian Law**

When it comes to people crossing the street, both motorists and pedestrians have responsibilities. Here is a brief summary of laws and regulations regarding pedestrians and crosswalks in Pennsylvania:

- 1) When a pedestrian crosses the street in a crosswalk, the driver must yield.
  - Drivers are not required to yield until the pedestrian begins to step in the crosswalk.
  - Pedestrians cannot walk or run suddenly or unexpectedly into the path of a moving vehicle.
  - It is illegal for drivers to pass a vehicle that is stopped for a pedestrian in a crosswalk.
- 2) If a pedestrian crosses the street not at an intersection and there is no crosswalk, the pedestrian must yield to the vehicle.
- 3) When crossing the street at a signalized intersection, both pedestrians and motorists must obey the traffic-control devices.
- 4) When walking along a road with sidewalks, it is unlawful for a pedestrian to walk along or upon the roadway.

\*This is just a brief summary of these laws. Please refer to PA Title 75 for the complete set of motor vehicle laws

# **Safety Tips For Pedestrians**

- Cross only at crosswalks.
- Remember to look left, right, and then left again.
- Don't cross between parked cars. Drivers won't see you until it's too late!
- Wait for a gap in traffic before crossing.
- · See drivers and let drivers see you. Make eye contact!
- Wear bright clothes during the day and reflective materials (and a flashlight) at night.
- · Watch for turning vehicles at intersections.
- Watch your children. Children have difficulty judging a vehicles speed and distance.
- If crossing multiple lanes, make sure all vehicles see you and stop. One car may stop, and the other may not see you.
- If no sidewalks are available, walk as far on the side of the road as you can and walk against traffic.
- Be aware of your surroundings. (Eyes off your phone and on the street. Take off your earphones).
- You must dismount from your bicycle and walk it in the cross walk. That is the law!

# **Safety Tips For Drivers**

- Slow down when approaching a crosswalk or intersection.
- Watch for pedestrians and yield to them.
- You must yield to pedestrians at both signalized and non-signalized crosswalks.
- · Watch out for mid-block crosswalks.
- Expect the unexpected. Children may dart out between cars or at any time without a crosswalk.
- Pay attention to the road and your surroundings. Eyes on the road, not on your phone!

# YARD WASTE COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Regular Season: April 1 - December 15 • Off-Season: December 16 - March 31

Yard waste is collected the **day after your trash/recycling pickup** and taken to a composting facility. **Preparation Requirements:** 

- Use biodegradable 30-gallon paper bags or labeled containers weighing under 50 lbs.
- · Plastic bags are not accepted.
- Tree branches/shrubbery must be:
  - Under 36 inches long
  - Less than 3 inches in diameter
  - Bundled and tied, taped, or placed in biodegradable bags
  - Not extending over the top of the container or bag

Place yard waste directly into your Northampton Township trash toters for pickup.

# What is Storm Water Runoff?

One of the most significant, yet unrecognized groups of water contaminants is storm water pollutants. When it rains, storm water runs over yards, streets, roads, highways, parking lots, parks, and playgrounds, carrying with it everything in its path, including debris and pollutants. Eventually, the water will travel to a stream, either over land or via a storm drain. Storm drains are frequently located alongside streets and parking lots. Unlike sanitary sewers that divert water to a treatment plant directly from your home, storm drains lead directly to surrounding lakes and rivers without any type of treatment. All the debris and pollutants that were picked up by storm water runoff end up in your lakes and streams!

### Where Does the Pollution Come From?

Most contaminants are made up of common items used by residents, businesses and visitors, such as fertilizers, car oils and greases, yard clippings, soil, and pet wastes. Below are some tips you can follow to help keep pollution from entering lakes and streams via storm water runoff.

### Tips to Keep Your Rivers, Lakes and Streams Clean

- · Never dump anything down a storm drain!
- Use an oil pan when changing oil to keep fluids off the pavement. Check local body shops and quick lubes to find a place to appropriately dispose of used oil.
- Bag pet waste and dispose of it in a trash can.
- Leave grass clippings on your lawn as an alternate nutrient to fertilizer. If a fertilizer is necessary, choose a slow-release product and test your soil to find out how much fertilizer your lawn actually needs.
- Wash your car on your lawn so excess water, chemicals, and dirt is filtered through the lawn.
- Keep household hazardous wastes, such as harsh cleaners, paint, car fluids, and batteries
  from entering lakes and streams by disposing at a household hazardous waste center. Try
  using environmentally-safe alternatives or recipes with non-hazardous ingredients.
- Use a broom rather than a hose to clean up grass clippings and dirt.
- Keep a trash bag in your car . . . and use it!



# Why bring your household hazardous wastes to a scheduled event?

Household products containing toxic chemicals, like pesticides, oil-based paints, solvents, cleaning products, weed killers and automotive batteries can be a threat to people and the environment if improperly discarded. Never throw these materials into the trash, as the toxic chemicals may harm sanitation workers, or result in fires in collection vehicles. It is also not safe to pour them into a sink or storm drain as they can end up in the environment polluting the air, water, or soil.

# Facts To Know About ... ELECTRIC BIKES





# PEDALCYCLE (E-BIKE)

# **E-RIDE or E-DIRT BIKE**

Electric Scooters, E-bikes, E-ride bike, E-ride dirt bikes, or similar electric powered vehicles have become a more popular way get around, but their legal status can be confusing for parents or riders. Because of this popularity, riders are facing increasing injuries & legal consequences due to crashes and/or violations of traffic laws.

Pennsylvania law is quite strict when it comes to these electric bikes on public roads including walking/bike paths. The Commonwealth considers them a vehicle, meaning they are not exempt from titling & registration requirements including safety equipment standards and inspection.

Regardless of the rider's age, most of the e-ride bikes or e-dirt bikes do not have the necessary equipment (such as lights, turn signals & mirrors) to meet these requirements; effectively making them illegal to ride on the roadway. The only place that most like e-ride bikes can be operated legally is on private property with appropriate permission.

If you are stopped by the police or their investigation confirms you were operating an illegal vehicle on a roadway, highway, bike lane, sidewalk or trail, you should expect:

- Each event will result in separate and/or compounding charges.
- Traffic citation(s) with significant fines that may affect the rider's driving privileges (even if you don't have your license yet) including points.
- Mandated court appearances to answer to the charges.
- The vehicle to be impounded; this will incur associated fees for towing and storage that need to be satisfied before return is considered. Storage could be for the length of the judicial process.
- The parent(s) will have to come pick the rider up from the scene or police head quarters.
- Depending on the vehicle and/or violation, there is a possibility of vehicle forfeiture.
- As a parent, you may be subject to the same charges (including penalties) as your child for allowing the violations to occur.
- Since the vehicle is uninsured, the rider will be financially responsible for restitution for damages you have caused. This includes another vehicle after a crash.

# **IN SUMMARY:**

## WHAT IS LEGAL?

In PA, an electric bike or e-bike is considered a "pedalcycle with electric assist" and must meet certain criteria:

- · Rider is a minimum age of 16;
- Must have operable pedals;
- · Electric motor under 750 watts;
- · Max speed of 20mph;
- · Weigh no more than 100 lbs.

## WHAT IS NOT LEGAL?

Regardless of what you call it or the type of tires it has, an e-ride bike, e-ride dirt bike, or e-ride moto bike are mostly advertised and stamped by the manufacturer as "offroad use only." This effectively confirms it is illegal to be operated in public areas such as the roadway, highway, bike lane, sidewalk or trail. This also applies if the vehicle is gas powered.

No person shall drive any vehicle on a highway that is not properly licensed to do so. SUMMARY CITATION (Traffic)

### §1575 | **PERMITTING A VIOLATION**:

No person shall authorize or permit a motor vehicle owned by them to be driven in violation of this provision. This charge would match the rider's violation and can be issued to the parent.

# §1786 REQUIRED INSURANCE:

Any person who fails to bring the vehicle to a stop or otherwise flees a police officer.

MISDEMEANOR (Criminal)

Plus, violations such as stop signs, red lights, speed limits, pedestrian crossing and required equipment (lights, signals, helmets, etc ...).

# **POLICE ACCREDITATION**

I am happy to announce that we continue to be part of the 189 law enforcement agencies in Pennsylvania and 26 in Bucks County that have earned the designation as an Accredited Police Department.

In June, the Northampton Township Police Department underwent a review conducted by the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police. This review occurs every three years in order for the department to be certified as an accredited police agency in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. In May, a team of independent professionals determined that the Northampton Township Police Department successfully implemented all applicable accreditation standards. Departmental procedures were reviewed, and an on-site inspection was performed. The process culminated with a decision by the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission to renew our accreditation for another three-

year cycle. This is the second renewal since our original designation in 2019.

As Chief of Police, I believe that accreditation extends agency accountability, helps to improve policy and best practices, as we deliver professional police services to our Northampton community.
