- Do not interrupt others when they are speaking
- Limit your comments to 3 minutes and may be adjusted by the Chairman as needed, to allow time for others to participate in the meeting discussion.
- Focus on positive, constructive outcomes.
- Avoid comments about personal matters; limit comments to Township business only.
- Do not hold side conversations; they are disruptive
- Encourage & support different points of view
- When in doubt, ask for clarification
- Recognize that everyone shares responsibility for the success of the community.

The Board believes that following these simple rules will encourage positive discourse on matters involving the Township and its government, improve cooperation among meeting participants, and help keep Northampton Township a great place to live, work, and raise a family.
